Haiticon Code of Conduct and Policies.

The purpose of Haiticon is to create a space where people can gather together, play games, meet friends, and have fun while raising money to support a Tuberculosis and HIV clinic in Haiti.

1. Treat those around you with respect and maturity.

It's you, the Haiticon community, who makes Haiticon successful. Haiticon works best when we all show respect for the people around us, strive to communicate clearly inside and outside of games, and act with maturity.

Please keep up the great work and refrain from the following behavior at Haiticon:

- Harassment
- Discrimination on any basis including gender preference, sexual orientation, race, color, national origin, ethnicity, religion, and/or disability
- Remember Haiticon is an alcohol free event!

2. Please keep Haiticon an inclusive event, regardless of people's background. We do not allow harassment or discrimination on any grounds.

We do not allow any pattern of behavior which intimidates, alarms, belittles or threatens any person, or which puts them in fear of their safety. This is the opposite of mature, respectful behavior. Please remember that all the meeple we are playing with at Haiticon are worth the same number of Victory Points regardless of their color or shape.

Failure to follow this code of conduct may result in:

- Mediation
- A verbal warning
- Ejection from Haiticon

Haiticon reserves the right to eject any attendee for any reason.

3. If you have a problem at the event, please approach a staff member or volunteer. We are here to support you.

The Haiticon staff are here to support you. Please approach us if you witness or experience any issues at the convention.

All Haiticon volunteers will be wearing Lanyards identifying that they are working for Haiticon. Please talk to any of us or email contact@haiticonsf.org with any concerns or issues.

4. Finally remember to be a good gaming citizen. We feel these rules are appropriate to all games, but especially keep them in mind in Werewolf where tempers can run high due to fear of execution or werewolves.

- Have fun and make sure everyone else is having fun!
- No insults
- No unsolicited criticism on choices (unsolicited compliments always welcome).
- Make sure everyone can be heard. Reel it in if you are being obnoxious, dominating or interrupting too much.
- Appreciate your moderator / game master / designer.
